5 ATTITUDES

which shape a **Bridges movement**

- 1. Depend on the Holy Spirit.** The essence of a spiritual movement is the Holy Spirit at work, transforming Christians and drawing unbelievers to Christ.
- 2. Encourage adventurous faith.** Trust God to reach the campus through the movement in extraordinary ways.
- 3. Stimulate expectant prayer.** Prayer undergirds every aspect of building a spiritual movement.
- 4. Cast a broad vision and clear purpose.** The growth of a movement is proportional to how well the individuals are gripped by a sense of purpose and cause.
- 5. Humble transfer of leadership.** Staff members entrust leadership to student and community volunteers.

5 ACTIONS

which build a **Bridges movement**

- 1. Initiate evangelism in word and deed throughout campus.** Staff and students are building relationships and sharing Christ with an enlarging circle of international students on campus.
- 2. Disciple the international student to become a spiritual multiplier.** Disciple students to be committed followers of Jesus and to transfer that commitment to other students.
- 3. Empower international students to take leadership in the movement.** Since involvement breeds commitment, empower students to own every element of the movement.
- 4. Create a strong sense of missional community as the international students seek to reach their campus.** Regular gatherings create momentum for both Christians and non-Christians.
- 5. Generate and mobilize people and resources to expand the movement.** The campus, churches, and surrounding community provide critical resources and support for the movement.
